I don't think that there would be a single Loxton Rotary Club member who, from 1987 onwards, would not have some vivid memories (perhaps not all of them good) regarding the Op Shop!

Things that instantly come to my mind that members had mentioned to me are:



- 1. Never having used a vacuum cleaner before.
- 2. Repeatedly unable to clean the Op Shop because he didn't have a key.
- 3. Using a paint brush for the first time.

My own Op Shop Firsts were:

- 1. Catching a woman trying to steal cloths. I challenged her on the issue and she told me that the cloths were being sent to her poor relatives in a third world country. I told the very embarrassed woman not to steal, and to pick whatever she could carry and consider it a donation from the Rotary Club of Loxton.
- 2. In the middle of winter, a heavily pregnant young woman wearing light summer cloths, was buying worm cloths for the young child on her hip. She was obviously limited financially. I struck up a conversation with her and whilst I didn't ask her for her name, I learned enough to be able to have a couple of Club members identify her. It turned out that her husband was spending their money on alcohol. A Club member made some sort of arrangement with Clarks Supermarket enabling her to buy food at the Club's (or perhaps that member's) expense when necessary.

A little Op Shop – Treasurer's Story

On Saturday mornings, the Rotary Club member rostered on would go next door to McLeod Tyres and pick up the Op Shop cash tin which always had \$50.00 in it - it also contained the key to the Op Shop front door.

There was no cash register in the Op Shop and it was rare that receipts on purchases were asked for, or given.

After closing the Op Shop at noon, the Rotarian on duty would count the money in the cash tin and enter the total amount into the carbon copied cash book. \$50.00 would be deducted from that amount (sales for the morning) and also entered in the cash book before the tin and its contents being returned to McLeod's safe.

During the week, I would go to McLeods and pick up the Op Shop cash tin and take it home.

I'd count the money, ensure there was \$50.00 (of the right denominations to allow for change), tear out the taking records from the cash book, bank the takings and return the tin to McLeods.

Sometimes the takings in the cash book was not what I had counted.

Charter Member of the Loxton Rotary Club, Paul King, was the key to the Op Shop being formed and at meetings he would often report on how much money the Op Shop had taken for a particular week or period – based on the Op Shop cash book.

The discrepancies in the cash tin were usually under by no more than two dollars, and I would make up the difference!



HOWEVER, on one occasion it was OVER by about \$5.00!

PROBLEM! I can't pocket Op Shop money to make the cash book balance!

Time for some counselling!

I shared the issue with a long term Rotarian. His response started with "You bloody Nit Wit!" and ended with "Record and bank what is correct! Some of our members are Bank Managers and Accountants – what do you expect?"

As Sergeant-at-Arms Robert Fielke opened the meeting, he noted the first time in his many years of Loxton Rotary history that the position of Chair would be shared.

Sarah provided the Invocation while Paula raised the loyal toast.

When introducing the Guest Speakers, Sarah noted as having been a teacher to both Armani Kakoschke and Reese Westbrook, that they boggled her mind with their creative and critical thinking. The third speaker was Lucas Cockshell.

Sarah explained that Armani was born in Tanzania, undertook some schooling in the USA, had returned to Tanzania before coming back to Australia where he finished his senior school years. She insisted his career HAD to involve science, and serious science!

In contrast, Reese is born and bred Loxton. Sarah recalled interesting projects he kept coming up with, one involving a mystery white powder that he had some unknown plan to make something out of. As his teacher she didn't quite know what to make of it, and is still none the wiser!

Both students were supported by our Rotary Club to the National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) in Brisbane earlier in the year.

Armani spoke first and described how the NYSF allowed him to network with other likeminded participants. They stayed at the Kings College boarding campus with around 200 other attendees. One lot of sessions was at the University of Queensland where they were introduced to specialists in each area of study. Another was at the Queensland University of Technology where they had more practical activities. Of particular interest was a workshop at Griffith Cyber Security.

His advice to future participants included the cryptic statement – check out sunscreen! Clearly something he found interesting.

Reece noted that they went in January, before the school year started, and he considered it helped him to work out what future direction he can take, or change it he wanted to. He thought it was a very well organised event, with transport from different accommodation to daily varying locations simple to use. Although he considered being a tourist at Sea World and the Gold Coast were good experiences, he really enjoyed the 'speed dating' career session with NYSF alumni. He found several ecologists, which is his interest. His favourite moment was a lecture in genetic modification of Australian plants for medicinal research.

Both referred to the recreation and social aspects of the week away, including sports activities, a disco, and even an 'a cappella' group which involved Armani.

They then played a short video compiled by one of the fellow NYSF students from Adelaide, very much in the 'young persons' style. Both thanked the Rotary Club of Loxton for the support to attend the event.

Lucas Cockshell is the most recent recipient of the Vocational Scholarship which the RCL awards each year to support a local student for their first two years of university study.

Lucas started by saying that although he was only six weeks into his first year of a Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering at Adelaide Uni, it was already very different and harder than he though it was going to be. Despite getting good grades at school, he found that the need for independent study, with no teachers to help, was a challenge.

What he has had to work out is a routine, that takes in the high workload, but still provides some life balance for fun as well.

Being keen on a career in the space industry, Lucas reached out to the Space Innovation group, and has arranged a tour of their establishment next week. He is looking into an internship as a way to get a foothold into the space industry before completing his study.

Where he has discovered support is at St Marks Residential College where he is living. However, as College us is not cheap, he really appreciates the financial support that the Loxton Rotary Vocational Scholarship provides him with, and he thanked Rotary for offering it.



Winners will be drawn from 3:00pm where the First Prize winner will be asked to step-up for their chance at the \$10,000.00 Jackpot.


