



ANOTHER HISTORY INSTALMENT OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF LOXTON – provided by the irrepressible Tony Moyle

Rotary Club of Loxton vs Minister of Defence

Early on the morning of Saturday, 17 May 1997, Dean Nicholson, Paul Pfitzner and Tony Moyle, all members of the Rotary Club of Loxton, drove to Waikerie for a prearranged rendezvous with Federal Parliamentarian, Neil Andrew MP, Member for Wakefield. On the return trip, Paul drove Tony's car, while Tony chauffeured Neil and Dean, comfortably seated in the spacious back seat of Neil's government car, east to Loxton.



The purpose of this exercise was to convince Neil that he should ask the Minister of Defence, the Hon Ian McLaughlan AO MP, to consider making available an Australian Defence Forces C130 Hercules Transport aircraft to fly from Loxton to Birdsville, via Port Pirie, and transport Rotarians to a major international event - the 'Australian Outback' International Rotary Meeting. With a little help from Tony via the rear view mirror, Dean put a very convincing argument to Neil.

Several months earlier, a Royal Australian Air Force C130 had landed in Loxton on a training exercise to improve their familiarity on the use of unsealed rural airstrips. We were confident we could fill all seats available on a C130, and were prepared to pay a minimum of \$100 per seat with the funds raised going to the RFDS.

As part of his argument Dean pointed out that the formation of the International Fellowship of Motorcycling Rotarians was the second Australian sponsored International Rotary Fellowship at that time, and in addition to the Australian riders crossing the Simpson Desert, the other Fellowship would also be raising money for the Royal Flying Doctor Service. There were going to be Rotacyclists from other countries riding as well, and the World President of Rotary International, Glen Kinross and his wife Heather, would also attend the Birdsville Dinner!

Dean and Tony received a faxed copy, dated 23/5/97, of the request that Neil had hand delivered to the Minister of Defence. The final line of the thankyou to Neil, on behalf of the Rotary Club of Loxton read: "Thanks! We know it's a long shot, and if it fails, it will not be for the lack of your support!"

We were not surprised by the Minister of Defence's response – the last line reading: "A further consideration is that flights in and out of unsealed runways, as is the case at Loxton, are usually operational in nature and, as such, are flights upon which the carriage of civilian passengers is not permitted."

Despite this minor setback, there were 146 Rotarians and friends at the World President's Banquet, 15th August 1997 in Birdsville!





17 of them had ridden motorcycles across the Simpson Desert, 28 of them had driven across the Simpson Desert in 14, 4WD support vehicles. Seven light aircraft carrying Rotarians and their partners flew into Birdsville, and numerous assorted vehicles had driven up the Birdsville Track.

\$10,000 was raised for the Royal Flying Doctor Service!

As an aside, unbeknown to Dean Nicholson, the Rotary Club of Loxton had planned bestowing a Paul Harris Award on Dean, and it was to be presented to him by the World President at Birdsville.



Not long before the event, Dean developed some health issues and decided it would not be wise for him to fly the Birdsville as planned! Loxton, being a small town and everybody knowing everybody else, someone spoke to Dean's doctor and explained the situation. The doctor, after having spoken to the pilot that Dean had intended flying with, and explaining to him what would be necessary if Dean was to take a turn for the worse, suggested to Dean that it should be okay for him to make the flight.

It was noted that our very own Sarah Edwards was slotted in as the guest speaker, but an overnight stint in hospital a couple of days earlier gave her a reasonable excuse not to show, and our Programs Coordinator Bert Haslam talked Donna Neale into filling the spot at very late notice. Donna was scheduled to talk to us next meeting in Renmark, but as her boat, the subject of the presentation, was possibly heading for dry-dock, it was a timely switch. Many thanks to Donna for filling in as such short notice.

Bert introduced Donna and reminded us of a dream that he and Tom shared about getting the Murray River Queen from Renmark down to Loxton, which now looks like it is coming to fruition.

Guest Speaker Donna Neale

Donna introduced herself as having been born in Loxton and at the age of eleven went to Adelaide with her family. About six years ago she returned and bought the established clothing store now known as Country Proud.

While the Murray River Queen's Thai Restaurant was in operation in Renmark she really enjoyed dining there, and was very disappointed when it closed. However, when the boat came on the market she saw an opportunity and started talking to the owners, but the buying process took around six months to negotiate. In April of 2021 she approached the Loxton Waikerie District Council with the idea of relocating the boat to Loxton...and so the saga began.



Her vision was, and still is, to create a colourful, sustainable destination that will a legacy not just for Loxton, but for South Australia.

Around three years ago Channel 9's Today Show produced a program where they stayed on the boat and were very excited with the experience. Shortly after that renovations were undertaken to upgrade the accommodation. Then COVID hit which created a very difficult time because Donna had only just taken over and started to invest in upgrading. She has plans to continue renovations, to the restaurant and café dining infrastructure, but also more to the accommodation as income starts to come in.

There have been many delays outside her control, initially with COVID then with the 2022-23 flood, but Donna was complimentary of the patience of the Renmark Paringa Council in dealing with those situations. Her lease with Council expired and she now has just two months to vacate, and she anticipates that by October the boat will be on the move.

Accommodation will be ready to go immediately upon being set up in Loxton, with 17 rooms available. However, until she has a definite date, she can't hire a chef to get the restaurant part of the business under way. The style of the restaurant is not yet set in stone, Donna is keen to get the right person to lead the food service side, so there will be a delay, hopefully not too long.

Donna noted that some structural renovations she has invested in might ultimately lead to the boat being brought back 'into survey' so it can operate as a paddle boat taking tours. She has a local captain

arranged for the difficult task of piloting it into dry dock, which apparently is challenging and requiring a high level of skill and experience, and is hoping she has someone available in the future should operational tours become a reality.

Several questions from members and guests indicated the interest we all have in this venture, with everyone very positive about having another food and accommodation option for Loxton, not only to provide choice, but to ensure existing providers have competition to keep their standards high.

After breaking for dinner, Craig restarted the meeting with reports.

Peter thanked the seven members who attended tonight's meeting, lamenting it was a pity our guest speaker has so few to speak to. Thank goodness we had several guests to pad out the numbers. However, it was very pleasing to received 13 active apologies, the strong hints that an apology is an expected courtesy if a member cannot attend, is hopefully bearing fruit and will continue.



Postie Bike Challenge – we have accepted to host them on their Brisbane to Adelaide ride overnight on Sunday 8 September, they will be almost 'home'. Apex don't have manpower so now talking to the Hockey Club to provide the Sunday evening meal due to the clash with Blythman's Breakfast planned for that morning. We can take advantage of providing breakfast Monday morning by duplicating Blythman's Breakfast only 24 hours prior. Melissa will help with costings as she will already be doing it.

Heaven project – Council have come back with wording for a sign. Note our suggestion of Heaven-on-Murray has been declined as it is listed on maps as simply 'Heaven' so it will stay that way. Signage wording has obligatory acknowledgement of Govt grant contribution, but Peter will liaise with Council to change the sequence of words to ensure the Rotary/Council partnership is obvious as the instigator of the project, not Govt as is implied on first draft.

AusCycling National Championships – Council has invested to bring this event to town for 19-22 September. Rotary has been requested to assist with one full day (8:30am-5pm) of marshalling requiring 10-20 people. If divided into two half-day shifts, that's 20-40 required! Only two members indicated they are available so resolved to advise Council we are unable to assist, but those interested encouraged to contact Sue Schultz at Council.

Walk for Respect – in Adelaide on September 14, Peter & Craig will attend with Loxton's banner. Encouraging others to join them...would love at least a carload.


